PAST INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR

Dominic Joseph Carlone, of New Orleans, Louisiana, USA, served a two-year term as a director of The International Association of Lions Clubs after his election at the association's 54th convention held in Las Vegas, Nevada, USA, June 1971.

Past Director Carlone, owner of a wholesale-distributor business, has been a member of the Belle Chasse Lions Club since 1961. He has served as a zone chairman, deputy district governor, and district governor. He is the recipient of seven Extension Awards, a Master Key, nine International President's Awards and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor bestowed upon association members.
