Kenneth G. Green, of St. John's, Newfoundland, Canada, served a two-year term as director of The International Association of Lions Clubs after his election at the association's 70th annual convention held in Taipei, Taiwan, July 1-4, 1987.

Past Director Green is a pharmacist and president of three pharmacies.
