PAST INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR

Dr. Warren E. Greene, of Monterey Park, California, USA, served a two-year term as a director of The International Association of Lions Clubs after his election at the association's 53rd International Convention held in Atlantic City, New Jersey, USA, in 1970.

Past Director Greene is a retired optometrist.

A Lion since 1948, Past Director Greene has served as a club president, district governor and vice-chairman of the multiple district council of governors. A Key Member, he is a Life Member of the Monterey Park Lions Club.

In appreciation of his service to the association, Past Director Greene has received nine International President's Awards, two District Governor's Extension Awards, the Leo Award for Public Relations and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor awarded to association members. He is also a Melvin Jones Fellow.

A recipient of numerous civic awards, Past Director Greene has been named the "Most Valuable Citizen of Monterey Park" by the American Legion, and the "Outstanding Young Man of Monterey Park" by the Jaycees. He was the founder of the California-Nevada White Cane Days, has served on the Executive Committees of the Foundation for the Junior Blind and the Southern California Lions Eye Institute and was responsible for the chartering of the first Leo club in California.
