PAST INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR

David I. Roberts, of Sun City, Arizona, USA, was elected to serve a two-year term as a director of The International Association of Lions Clubs at the association's 85th International Convention, held in Osaka, Japan, July 8-12, 2002.

Past Director Roberts is vice president and senior investment associate of a financial management and advisory company.

In recognition of his service to the association, Past Director Roberts has received numerous awards, including four District Governor's Awards, two International President's Certificates of Appreciation and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor the association bestows upon its members. He is also a Melvin Jones Fellow.

In addition to his Lions activities, Past Director Roberts is active in numerous professional and community organizations. He has been involved with the Sun City Area Corp of the Salvation Army. He also served as chairperson of the City of Flagstaff Traffic Commission, on the board of directors of the Homeowners' Association and as a national committeeman of the Boy Scouts of America. He is also a recipient of the Boy Scouts of America's Award of Merit and Silver Beaver Award.
