PAST INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR

William A. Rollins, of Portland, Oregon, USA, was appointed to serve a two-year term as a director of The International Association of Lions Clubs at the association's 85th International Convention, held in Osaka, Japan, July 8-12, 2002.
